Another theme this week has been charity work. Several children, staff members, and other local residents have approached me about supporting a number of causes. This is absolutely something we wish to do -particularly when the causes have direct links to our own school community. I would like each year group to choose a charity to support, as well as for the student council to identify school wide causes for this year. I then want to put this together on a calendar of when and how we will fund raise so that we can ensure it is spread throughout the year and is manageable. Of course, any fundraising is voluntary but I know the children are desperate for a mufti day so this will be a popular one, and I want you to have forewarning of this.

I had a fantastic time visiting Compass Primary School on Wednesday and catching up with the wonderful Mrs Fallowell. We both got very excited about some of the ways our school communities could work more closely together - watch this space!

Friday saw us remember in school the lives of those past and present who have given their lives to protect us. If you weren't aware, this year's remembrance theme is service, and we talked about how courage and selflessness are a central part of that. We reflected on how we could demonstrate those qualities in our day-to-day life in the KSA community as we look to support each other. I also shared my sister's story and some of the photos and letters she had sent whilst she was serving in Iraq in 2003.

Finally, Friday was also a very exciting day for Mrs Gant (Vice Principal) and I as we had our first choir rehearsal!
