#### Mock Exams: A Vital Learning Experience



# Parental Feedback This Week

I've continued to meet with parents this week, which I always enjoy. These conversations are a wonderful opportunity to hear about what we're getting right but, most importantly, what we can do better.

#### **Key Topics This Week**

- 1. Homework:
- Homework is an important tool for consolidating learning, and we encourage students to engage with it. However, we recognise that it doesn't work equally well for all children.
- While we celebrate and acknowledge the efforts of those who complete homework, it should not be a source of undue stress or result in sanctions for

**students who may find it more challenging.** Additionally, students will not be penalised for not meeting a specific level or threshold.

• Our focus remains on supporting every student and helping them develop strategies that work for their individual needs. If you have concerns about homework, please contact your child's teachers.

# 2. Rewards:

- Some of you have highlighted the importance of consistency in how rewards, particularly K Points, are awarded. We agree!
- To address this, we've developed an **analytics tool to monitor and track how points are awarded across the school.** This transparency allows us to ensure that all students are recognised fairly for their efforts and achievements.
- We're also enhancing initiatives like **Hidden Gems**, which celebrate students who consistently demonstrate our core values, and are working to make our reward systems more inclusive and varied.

# 3. Colder Weather:

- We will clarify our uniform expectations later this week now that the weather is getting colder.
- We will, as always, take a pragmatic approach for example, allowing children to wear their coats as they move around the building.

Thank you to all the parents who shared their thoughts this week—your feedback is invaluable in helping us improve.

#### **AIB Feedback: A Positive Visit**

Last week, I shared that we would be welcoming the Brooke Weston Trust Director of Education for a visit. I'm pleased to say it was a very positive experience.
