Social Time Strategy Update

I'm pleased to say that our **social time strategy** continues to work really well, with significant improvements in areas like litter management. Last week, we introduced our **Social Time Caught Doing the Right Thing (CDTRT)** ticket initiative, and I'm happy to report that students are collecting their tickets with enthusiasm, looking forward to exchanging them for rewards. We will be conducting an analysis to ensure the improvements we're seeing match the statistics, and we'll share these findings with you soon.

Following the success of our **Open Evening** last week, where we welcomed over 800 visitors to the school, we've had the pleasure of welcoming several families into school during the day this week. Over 30 families visited to see the school in action, and it's been great to receive such positive feedback about the atmosphere and engagement of both students and staff.
