While it's early days, we're encouraged by the **success we're seeing**, and I'm confident this method will support **positive outcomes** for our young people.

Celebrating Attendance Progress

We've also been able to **reward children** for their **attendance progress** this week. For some young people, simply being in school can be a real accomplishment, and we made sure to:

- Celebrate those who have shown excellent progress.
- Focus on individual attendance targets.

Recognising their **commitment** to school, especially when it's challenging, is something we value deeply.
